This case came before the court upon a

petition of said Joseph Smith, Senior, to

be appointed guardian of the person of

the said Joseph Smith, Junior, as follows:

STATE OF ILLINOIS, ss.

To the Honorable the Municipal Court, of the

City of Nauvoo, Hancock County, and State of Illi-

nois:—

That your petitioner, Joseph Smith, Senior, who

has been arrested by and under the name of

Joseph Smith, Junior, and on oath, that he is

now detained as a prisoner, and in the custody

of Joseph H. Reynolds, in the said city of Nau-

voo, and stated Illinois, and that your peti-

tioner is a citizen of the State of Missouri, and

that your petitioner was arrested by one Har-

mon G. Willard, by virtue of what purports to be a war-

rant issued by His Excellency, Thomas Ford, Gov-

ernor of the State of Illinois, in the county of

Lee, and state of Illinois, and by said Willard,

your petitioner was delivered into the custody

of said Joseph H. Reynolds, and afterward

the county of Lee, aforesaid; that said sup-

posed warrant, as issued by His Excellency, Thomas

Ford, Governor as aforesaid, and the arrest

thereupon, and the imprisonment consequent

thereupon, by said Willard, and afterward

by said Joseph H. Reynolds, is illegal, and

void, and that your petitioner is, without the au-

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zation of the said Governor, and without the au-

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hind within the limits of the State aforesaid,

and cause him to be safely kept and delivered

to the custody of Joseph H. Reynolds, Esq.,

who has been duly constituted the agent of the

said State of Missouri to receive the said writ

of habeas corpus, and to keep him in custody

until he shall be brought before the court

to which he shall be brought, and to cause him

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
