Penning Fruit Trees.—It will be found upon an experiment, that a wound made on a tree in March or April, will look black as soon as the sap begins to flow, and that the sap will once out until the leaves have put!

It has been my humble but to spend the most of my time in the spring and fore part of the summer, in engrafine and pruning fruit trees; and my experience goes to prove that the best time for pruning is when the leaves are full grown, and the tree is in a vigorous and growing state. For, at this season, when the sap has been spent in the foliage, and the portes of the wood are filled, so that when the limb is taken off, the sun and warm weather will dry the end of the limb and close the pures of the wood against the weather, and the sap will keep the limb aive to the very end, and the healing will be perceived immediately.
