The Minister gols on to say that in order to prosecute the war with vigor, a loan, either national or foreign, of \$15,000,000 will be necessary to raise this large amount, which means that wealthy citizens of Mexico must be compelled to lend assistance. First. The Government is authorized to contract a loan, either national or toreign, which may bring into the Treasury a disposable amount of fitneen millions of dollars.

Second. For the extinction of the debt created by this loan, and the payment of the interest, the Government will hypothecate all the revenues of the nation not already hypothecated for other payments.
